

Johnnie Jezierski is a Sergeant with the Texas Department of Public Safety Criminal Intelligence Service stationed in Houston, Texas. The Criminal Intelligence Service is a part of the Criminal Law Enforcement Division of the Texas Department of Public Safety.

Sergeant Jezierski began his law enforcement career in 1980 at the Washington County Sheriff Department where he worked as a deputy sheriff and criminal investigator. In 1990 he joined the Texas Department of Public Safety and worked as a Highway Patrol Trooper in Waller County for eight years. In 1998 he joined the Special Crimes Service of DPS.

After September 11, 2001, Sergeant Jezierski has focused primarily on Middle East Organized Crime and Central American criminal groups, and their involvement in the theft of infant formula, over the counter medicines, and other consumer goods.

Sergeant Jezierski has worked with federal, state and local police and government agencies and businesses targeting this criminal activity, and their cooperative efforts have significantly impacted the criminal organizations' activities in Texas and the United States.

Sergeant Jezierski has been involved in criminal investigations targeting the criminal organizations and he has also met with affected businesses and government agencies and has presented testimony at a Congressional field hearing of the Government Reform Committee held in Houston. As a result, government program policy changes along with state and federal legislative changes have been enacted or proposed. Sergeant Jezierski has also provided educational programs and bulletins concerning Middle East Organized Crime to law enforcement agencies and business groups.
