Biography

Mr. McCraw is from El Paso, Texas, and holds a Bachelor of Science degree and a Master of Arts degree from West Texas State University. Mr. McCraw served as a State Trooper and Sergeant Investigator for the Texas Department of Public Safety prior to his appointment as a Special Agent to the FBI in 1983. He served in the FBI for over 21 years until his retirement in August 2004.

Mr. McCraw was assigned to the Dallas, Pittsburgh, Los Angeles, Phoenix (Tucson) and San Antonio Field offices. FBI Headquarters assignments included Unit Chief of an Organized Crime Unit; an Inspector; Deputy Assistant Director; Assistant Director of the Office of Intelligence, which was established in February 2002; and Assistant Director for the Inspection Division where he was responsible for re-engineering, strategic planning, internal investigations and bureau-wide performance evaluations. He also served as the Inspector-In-Charge of the South East Bomb Task Force and the Director of the Foreign Terrorism Tracking Task Force, which was established by the President in October, 2001.

In August 2004, Mr. McCraw was appointed by Governor Rick Perry as Director of the Governor's Office of Homeland Security.
