On 12/28/09 Deputy Bean and I took an extra job w security for their high school Annual Holiday Basketball security for the games from 0830 until about 2230 hours Alvin, Fairview, and Harby Junior High Schools. The la gym of Harby Junior High School located on CR 145, in approximately 2145 hours, I observed one of the athletes floor of the gym and begin to have muscle contractions went to the aid of the young man and were soon joined by the persons that arrived to help the victim was Coach Fred wearing nurse's scrubs. The lady identified herself as a mother. I heard her state that her son, Tony, had a history with seizures of this nature before. I then took Tony's leg Deputy Bean and Tony's mother spoke to Tony and tried convulsions and evaluated him for other injuries. After a passed since I began monitoring Tony's pulse, I noticed longer. I announced to Tony's mother that I was not able search for it on his neck. After a brief search, she checked he was not breathing. Deputy Bean and I then rolled Tony Tony's jersey and undershirt and held it away from his b clothing away from his torso. I then began chest compress respirations. Deputy Bean called 911 and advised the dis ambulance to our location and advised some of the onloc crowd from the gym. At some point, Coach Fredrick arri compressions, applied the pads to Tony's chest and we th continued to give chest compressions until the AED advi Fredrick operated the AED and delivered a shock and aft a few sets of compressions and respirations, the AED ad

Fredrick delivered the shock. After approximately 8-10 the ambulance arrived from Alvin EMS and attached th advised that there was no pulse. The EMS personnel ca CPR and after a short time delivered another shock or t of the number of shocks that were delivered to Tony, he either 3 or 4 times total. I then began chest compression EMS so that they could monitor Tony's vitals. EMS mo heart had begun beating on its own again and for me to Tony began to breathe on his own and Deputy Bean, Co Tony onto the ambulance and they delivered him to the personnel on scene that Tony's condition was improvin loaded onto the Life Flight Helicopter.

Butch Roberson, Chaplin, announced that a long time member, Dennis Richards has passed away and the chapter did send flowers to the family.
